





- →Average Sunday morning attendance = 85

- → Median house-hold income of attendees: Over \$60,000.





Attendance, Fund Balances, Giving, New Members:


2023 Mission Budget/Giving:

History – the first 100 years...

- Organized April 20th, 1822, by three brethren.
 - Membership grew to seven within a day with baptism taking place in the east fork of Donnels Creek adjacent to current church site.
 - ♦ All baptisms occurred in the same creek until the 1930's.
- ◆The name Bethel was chosen since it means "house of worship."
 - Located in Bethel Township and church services were held in a grove across from a primitive schoolhouse named Bethel School.
 - Church services were held in Bethel School during inclement weather.
 - ♦ First church building was a log building erected in 1837.
 - ♦ That first structure was replaced with a more modern (brick) structure in 1879.
 - ♦ In 1921, the church purchased Bethel School.



History – the second 100 years...

- → Bethel flourished with great growth in the 1950's, 60's and 70's.
 - In 1959, the church building was remodeled with an addition of several classrooms and an expansion of the sanctuary.
 - ♦ Bethel established a strong missions-support culture, always finishing "top-ten" in per capita missions support among ABC churches.
 - ♦ A parsonage was built across from the church in 1967.
 - ♦ Sunday morning attendance peaked in the early 70's, averaging over 200+ attending Sunday School and the Sunday Morning Worship Service.
 - ♦ The sanctuary was remodeled in 1981 and again in 2006.
 - ♦ The entire facility was updated (including the parsonage) from 2006-2019.
- → Music has always played a significant role in Bethel's worship
 - Many members bought and carried their own song book along with their Bible in the early years.
 - Bethel has always had strong music leadership, as well as a choir, organist, and pianist.

History – the next 100 years...

- → Bethel has been fortunate from its beginning to the present to have a membership and leadership that exhibit:
 - ♦ A can-do attitude.
 - ♦ A caring, friendly, welcoming atmosphere.
 - ♦ A variety of musical talent.
 - An interest in Biblical insight.
- →We expect the next 100 years are the best yet.
