But praise God that His word provides us insight into the answer to this question. The short answer to this question is found in Acts 2:42: "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." We gather together to worship God, dine together, observe Communion, and to pray. Certainly, we enjoy the social aspects of our gatherings and we should! It's part of who we are as the community of faith. However, such gatherings are not the only reason for gathering. We gather to pray together and learn and when we gather, such prayer should be for others, churched and unchurched, for God's will to be on earth as it is in heaven, and our learning and response to such learning should be grounded in scripture. As I've often heard it expressed, we are to be "people of the Book." As such, our conversations should be uplifting others as Paul reminds the church of Corinth: "No one should seek their own good, but the good of others (1 Corinthians 10:24)" or to the church at Ephesus he writes: "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen (Ephesians 4:29)." Following this passage, Paul cautions believers not to grieve the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 4:30) so our teaching, learning, and conversations about these or other issues should seek to uplift others and glorify God! K.I.A.J. . . Keep It About Jesus! This applies to all we do and say as a community of faith!
